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# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

#### **Economic Snapshot**

**The County continues a path of steady recovery following the 2020 pandemic.** Since 2020 approximately half of the county's industries recouped some or all of jobs they lost during the pandemic. Manufacturing and Accommodation and Food Services have added the most jobs in the post-pandemic period, while other sectors, such as Health Care and Social Assistance, as well as Finance and Insurance, have sustained further job loss since the initial pandemic shock.

**Despite positive trends in some of the county's most specialized industries, job losses exceeded job growth between 2018-2023**. Jobs were down -2.8% during these five years. The County fared better than the Southern Tier, which lost -5.0% of its employment base over 2018-2023.

Manufacturing industries propelled the county's Gross Regional Product (GRP) forward in the last five years. From 2018-2022, Chenango County saw steady GRP growth. From 2021-2022, GRP grew by about 30%.

**Production occupations account for the largest share of Chenango County's workforce.** This is correlated to the county's concentration of Manufacturing industries. 15% of Chenango County's jobs are in Production Occupations, compared to only 7% in the Southern Tier overall.

**Chenango County is a net exporter of workers, meaning that more people commute out of Chenango for work than in.** Around 60% of Chenango County's residents work in other counties like Broome, Onondaga, and Otsego.

#### Manufacturing

- Manufacturing is a powerhouse industry in Chenango County. It plays a large role in the stability and growth of the county's economy and has propelled economic growth since the pandemic.
- Manufacturing netted more job growth from 2018-2023 than the next four fastest-growing industries combined.
- The growth of the manufacturing industry drove GRP growth in 2022. From 2018-2022, Manufacturing GRP in Chenango County increased from \$824.6 million to almost \$1.1 billion.
- Chenango County's most concentrated manufacturing industries also tend to have high average earnings. For example, Dairy and Pharmaceutical Manufacturing have average earnings of over \$100,000 annually.
- Nearly all of Chenango County's largest manufacturing industries experienced notable job growth in the last five years. However, the county's smaller manufacturing industries experienced a combined 20% decline in employment during the five years from 2018-2023.

#### Agriculture

- Despite a declining number of farms in Chenango County, the total farming land area, the value of sales, and farm income all increased from 2017 to 2022 (*based on the 2022 US Agriculture Census*).
- In 2022, Chenango County dairy farmers had sales of over \$71.6 million, accounting for 58% of the total value of agricultural products sold by Chenango County farmers that year.

#### Entrepreneurship


- 6% of Chenango County's total employment is represented by self-employed workers, accounting for 1,039 jobs in 2023.
- As of 2021, about 4.5% of all businesses in Chenango County were less than a year old. Chenango County performs similarly to other Southern Tier Counties in this regard other than Delaware and Schuyler Counties, the Southern Tier counties have startup rates that generally fall between 3.5%-5%.

# **INTRODUCTION**

County

The economic trends analysis considers several different geographical areas to compare local and regional trends, as well as to align with the available data sources.

**Chenango County** is the primary study geography. New York State's Southern Tier Regional Economic Development Council (REDC) area was used as a comparison geography for Chenango County. The Southern Tier REDC includes Broome, Chemung, Delaware, Schuyler, Steuben, Tioga, Tompkins, and Chenango Counties.




# ECONOMY OVERVIEW

### **Total Jobs**

Chenango County has seen steady employment growth since the COVID-19 economic shock, while 2022 was a strong year for GRP growth. Note that jobs counts provided in this section are jobs that are within the county boundaries, irrespective of where a worker lives.

- Chenango County had just over 18,600 total jobs before the pandemic in 2019 but experienced a job loss of approximately 1,000 jobs in 2020.
- Since 2020, the County has recovered almost 700 jobs, bringing overall employment to within approximately 300 jobs of the prepandemic level of 2019.
- From 2018-2022, Chenango County saw steady GRP growth. Between 2021-2022, GRP grew significantly, adding 30% from around \$2.11 billion to nearly \$2.75 billion.
- The growth of the manufacturing industry drove GRP increases in 2022. From 2018-2022, Manufacturing GRP in Chenango County increased from \$824.6 million to almost \$1.1 billion. See page 16 for the breakdown of manufacturing subsectors contributing to this growth.

## **High-Level Job Distribution**

- Manufacturing is the largest sector in Chenango County, with over 5,100 jobs, or 28% of total employment.
- Manufacturing is followed by Government, with over 3,900 jobs, and Retail Trade, with about 1,900 jobs in 2023

## **Employment Dynamics During and After COVID-19**

Some of Chenango County's sectors have been more resilient post-pandemic than others, including those most impacted by COVID-19 such as Accommodation and Food Services and Retail Trade.

- Nearly all sectors experienced job loss between 2018-2020, much of which was driven by COVID-19 related impacts.
- Government was the hardest-hit sector during the pandemic, driven primarily by losses in public education. Of the total 317 jobs lost in Government from 2018-2020, 259 of these jobs came from Local Government Education and Hospitals.
- However, since 2020, approximately half of sectors within the county have recouped some or all of these lost jobs. Manufacturing and Accommodation and Food Services have added the most jobs in the postpandemic period, while other sectors, such as Health Care and Social Assistance, as well as Finance and Insurance, have sustained further job loss since the initial pandemic shock.

## Commuting

Around 60% of Chenango County's residents work in other counties. The data suggests that Chenango County is a net exporter of workers, meaning that more people commute out of Chenango for work than in.

- Outside of Chenango County, the most common counties where workers live are Broome, Otsego, and Oneida.
- Similar county relationships exist where Chenango residents work, with Broome, Onondaga, and Otsego being the most common work locations for • residents.

### **Remote Workers**

Approximately 7% of Chenango County workers aged 16+, totaling just over 1,400, work from home. This is according to data reflecting the five years from 2018-2022. The industries with the highest share of remote workers are Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting; Information; and Finance, and Insurance and Real Estate and Rental and Leasing, where over 20% of workers who live in Chenango County work from home.

By total number of workers, Finance and Insurance, and Real Estate and Rental and Leasing accounts for the most remote workers living in Chenango County, at just over 300. This is followed by Educational Services and Health Care and Social Assistance (242) and Manufacturing (225).

### **Sector Characteristics**

Manufacturing and Agriculture are Chenango County's most concentrated sectors, and both grew faster than expected from 2018-2023, given national economic and industry trends.

• Manufacturing; Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting; Government, Finance and Insurance; and Retail Trade are all industries with employment that is more concentrated in Chenango County than in the US on average. In addition to Manufacturing and Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting, Retail Trade also had a competitive advantage from 2018-2023.

• Utilities, Finance and Insurance, and Manufacturing are the sectors with the highest average earnings in Chenango County.

#### **Location Quotient and Competitive Effect**

Both the location quotient and the competitive effect help to illustrate what makes a region unique.

**Location quotient (LQ)** is a measure of industry concentration within a region. An LQ of 1.0 means that an industry is as concentrated within the region as it is on a national level. An LQ greater than 1.0 indicates that an industry is more concentrated in a region than at the national level.

The **competitive effect** illustrates how much change in an industry is not explained by national economic or industry trends and is expressed in the number of jobs that a region gained or lost beyond expectations given national and industry trends. A positive competitive effect means that the region has unique characteristics giving it a competitive advantage in that respective industry.


## **Chenango County's Most Concentrated Industries**

#### Chenango County's employment is highly concentrated among a few key industries, many of which are in Manufacturing.

- All industries with a location quotient above 10.0 are Manufacturing industries. Dairy Product and General Purpose Machinery Manufacturing are the most concentrated, at 61x and 46x the average in the US.
- Chenango County's most concentrated industries also tend to be those with high average earnings, such as Dairy and Pharmaceutical Manufacturing.

This data reflects **industries** and includes all different types of occupations that work in a given industry. For example, Dairy Product Manufacturing includes all workers who work in the dairy industry, from technicians to managers and executives.

#### Most Concentrated Industries in Chenango County, 2023 (Location Quotient)



## **Growing and Declining Sectors**

#### Manufacturing netted more job growth from 2018-2023 than the next four fastest-growing sectors combined.

- Manufacturing added 254 new jobs during the five-year period, followed by Real Estate, Administrative, Support, and Waste Management, and Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting. Since 2020, Chenango County has recovered 687 jobs, driven by gains in Manufacturing, Retail Trade, and Accommodation and Food Services.
- Losses in other sectors offset job gains in the sectors noted above. The Government sector lost 364 jobs during this time (primarily driven by a decrease in state government and local education employment), the most of any sector, though most of this was largely due to pandemic effects in 2020 and 2021. Other sectors that were hard-hit by the pandemic, such as Health Care and Social Assistance, Information, and Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation also saw significant job losses, as did other sectors such as Finance and Insurance and Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services.




#### Job Change by Industry in Chenango County, 2018-2023

## **Gross Regional Product**

GRP Distribution by Industry in Chenango County, 2022

Chenango County's GRP is driven by Manufacturing, followed by Government, and Finance and Insurance.

- Manufacturing industries generated \$1.1 billion in GRP in 2022. This accounts for just over 39% of all the county's GRP.
- Finance and Insurance generated \$377.5 million in GRP for Chenango County which accounts for about 14% of GRP.

## Largest Industries by Total Jobs

#### Chenango County's economy is somewhat concentrated in industries with high average annual earnings.

- Three of the five largest industries by employment in Chenango County have average annual earnings higher than the average for all industries (\$73,225). These include Local Education & Hospitals, General Purpose Machinery Manufacturing, and Dairy Product Manufacturing.
- According to Commerce Chenango, the largest employers in Chenango County include Chobani in New Berlin (Dairy Product Manufacturing) and The Raymond Corporation in Greene (Other General Purpose Machinery Manufacturing). Both large employers have contributed to the growth of their respective industries and positively impacted the overall economy. Both of these industries are not only the largest employers but also have high earnings and strong employment growth over the last five years.
- Other large employer industries in Chenango County include Restaurants, Financial and Insurance industries, and Pharmaceutical and Medicine Manufacturing.

#### Large employers and agribusiness industries are contributing to strong employment growth in the County.

• Other General Purpose Machinery Manufacturing, which includes The Raymond Corporation, added the most jobs to Chenango County's economy from 2018-2023 (+274, 24%).

• Industries related to agribusiness make up a large share of the job growth occurring within the county. This group includes **Dairy Product Manufacturing, Crop Production, Animal Food Manufacturing, and Other Food Manufacturing**. Together, these industries added a combined 259 jobs in the last five years.

Production Occupations account for the largest share of Chenango County's workforce, which is unsurprising given the county's concentration of Manufacturing industries.

• 15% of Chenango County's jobs are in Production Occupations, compared to only 7% in the Southern Tier overall.

• Other top occupations in Chenango County are Office and Administrative Support, Sales and Related Occupations, Transportation/Material Moving Occupations, and Educational Instruction and Library Occupations.

• Chenango County has a lower concentration of Healthcare occupations, both practitioners and support, and lower concentration of workers in Educational Occupations as well as Food Preparation and Serving Occupations.

#### Most of the largest occupations in Chenango County have low barriers to entry.

- Retail workers, cashiers, and fast food workers make up the three largest occupations in Chenango County in 2023, each requiring no formal education credential for entry-level positions.
- Overall, most of the largest occupations in the county require a High School diploma or less. Exceptions to this include Teaching Assistants and General and Operations Managers.
- Note that the Typical Entry-Level Education column represents a snapshot of the industry, and actual requirements will likely vary from business to business, especially in a tight labor market.

## Job Openings

Fast Food Counter Workers, Cashiers, and Retail Salesperson were the most in-demand occupations in Chenango County from 2018-2023, and are projected to remain the most in-demand occupations in the next five years. Overall, there were an average of 2,715 job openings throughout the county from 2018-2023. From 2023-2028, the average annual openings are projected to decline slightly, to 2,319 per year.

# INDUSTRY DEEP DIVE - MANUFACTURING PROFILE


General Purpose Machinery Manufacturing and Dairy Product Manufacturing account for approximately half of all Manufacturing employment in Chenango County.

- This is likely driven by the presence of two large employers, including The Raymond Corp. (forklift manufacturing) and Chobani (dairy product manufacturing).
- Nearly all of Chenango County's largest manufacturing industries experienced notable job growth in the last five years. However, the county's smaller manufacturing industries experienced a combined 20% decline in employment during the five years from 2018-2023.

Overall, Manufacturing added about 250 net new jobs to the Chenango County economy from 2018-2023, driven by growth in a few key industries.

- The fastest-growing manufacturing industry from 2018-2023 was General Purpose Machinery Manufacturing, which added almost 275 jobs.
- Other high-growth manufacturing industries during this time were Dairy Product Manufacturing, Foundries, and Animal Food Manufacturing.
- Conversely, Industrial Machinery Manufacturing experienced the steepest job loss, declining 77 jobs from 2018-2023.

• Other industries with the greatest job loss during that same period include Bakeries & Tortilla Manufacturing (-58), Printing & Related Activities (-56), and Aerospace Product and Parts Manufacturing (-50).

## Chenango County's manufacturing workforce generally requires few educational barriers to entry and offers somewhat better wages than the overall economy.

• Miscellaneous Assemblers and Fabricators as well as Packaging and Filling Machine Operators are the two largest manufacturing occupations in Chenango County, accounting for a combined 13% of the manufacturing workforce.

• 19 of the top 25 manufacturing occupations in Chenango County require a High School diploma or less. Exceptions that require higher educational credentials include engineers, managers, heavy and tractor-trailer truck drivers, and bookkeeping clerks.

• Meanwhile, approximately half of the top 25 manufacturing occupations offer median hourly earnings greater than the county average (\$20.62). Occupations with the highest median earnings are Industrial Production Managers, Mechanical Engineers, Industrial Engineers, and General Managers.

This data reflects **occupations**, which are categorized based on an individual's specific job role or position, regardless of the industry in which they work.



## Despite a declining number of farms in Chenango County, total farming land area, value of sales, and farm income have all increased from 2017 to 2022.

• There were 656 farms in Chenango County in 2022, 15% fewer than five years prior. Data from the 2022 Census of Agriculture suggests that this decrease in the number of farms is likely due to consolidation because the size of farms has increased over the last five years. The census documented that the increase in the average size of farms from 2017-2022 was 19%.

• Approximately two-thirds of the county's agriculture sales are from livestock, while the remaining third is from crops.





#### Dairy is by far Chenango County's highest-value agriculture product.

- In 2022, Chenango County dairy farmers had sales of over \$71.6 million, accounting for 58% of the total value of agricultural products sold by Chenango County farmers that year.
- Other key agricultural products in Chenango County include vegetables, melons, and potatoes; other crops and hay; grains; oilseeds; dry beans and peas; and cattle.



#### 2023 Self-Employment Jobs by Industry in Chenango County




6% of Chenango County's total employment is represented by self-employed workers, accounting for 1,039 jobs in 2023.

- Construction and Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting jobs account for the greatest number of self-employed workers in 2023.
- Overall, the number of self-employed workers throughout the county has declined by 3% from 5 years prior, driven by declines in Other Services, Construction, and Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation.
- Self-employment declines in some sectors were partially offset by growth in others, primarily Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting.
- Overall, Chenango County has a similar share of selfemployed workers as the United States (7%).


## **Startup Activity**

Startup activity in Chenango County has been on a slightly downward trend over the last two decades but is overall on par with most other counties in the Southern Tier.

- As of 2021, about 4.5% of all businesses in Chenango County were less than a year old. Chenango County performs similarly to other Southern Tier Counties in this regard – other than Delaware and Schuyler Counties, the Southern Tier counties have startup rates that generally fall between 3.5%-5%.
- The share of first-year startups in Chenango County has declined since 2001 when around 6% of businesses fell into this category. The rate of startups in the county had a strong growth trajectory through 2008 when the Great Recession spurred a significant drop in startup activity. Startup activity declined in 2019 and was more volatile in 2020 and 2021.



#### Firms <1 Year Old as a Share of Total, 2021




## Firms <1 Year Old as a Share of Total in Chenango County, 2001-2021

### Establishment Entry, Exit, and Churn

The rate at which businesses are created in Chenango County is higher than the rate at which businesses close. It also has the lowest business exit rate in the Southern Tier.

- Chenango County's business entry rate falls around the middle of the pack compared to other Southern Tier counties, at 7.4%. However, it does have the lowest business exit rate among all eight counties.
- Construction, Retail Trade, and Accommodation and Food Services have the strongest establishment churn rates, with significantly higher entry rates than exit rates. Conversely, Health Care and Social Assistance, Manufacturing, and Real Estate have significantly higher exit rates than entry rates.



#### Chenango County's economy is largely made up of small businesses. 98% of businesses have fewer than 100 employees.

- Over half of all businesses in the county have fewer than five employees, representing about 470 total businesses.
- Overall, only 2% of all businesses have more than 100 employees, pointing to the significance of small businesses in the county's economy.

**OnTheMap** is a tool developed through the US Census Longitudinal Employer-Household Dynamics (LEHD) program that helps to visualize Local Employment Dynamics (LED) data about where workers are employed and where they live. It offers visual mapping

capabilities for data on age, earnings, industry distributions, race, ethnicity, educational attainment, and sex.
